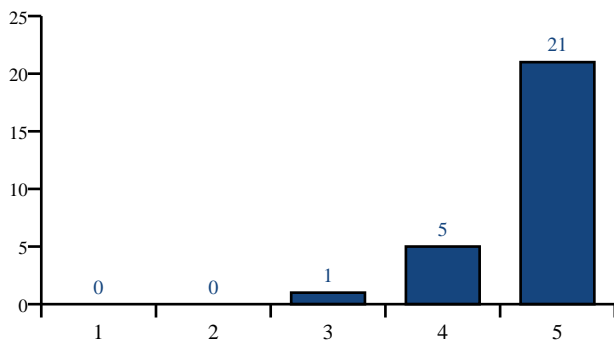

Anonymous delegate ratings collected after the course.

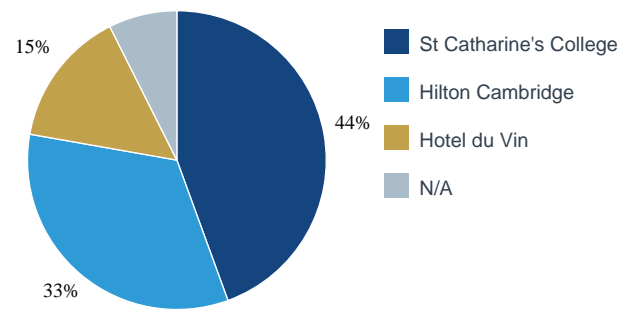
Overall satisfaction with SCOPE 2025

Suggestions for improvement

We review every comment. These are the improvements delegates suggested — and that we are taking forward for future courses.

What delegates suggested

- More time for discussion on each topic; shorten some lectures and reduce the number of topics.
- Smaller breakout / round-table groups on focused themes — unmet clinical needs, developing and bringing a product to market, clinical-study design and regulatory approval.
- Orchestrated debates, a live voting system, and more varied formats (short pitch-style presentations).
- Engage promising junior colleagues, and invite engineers from academia and large companies (e.g. Philips, Siemens) on innovation and future trends.
- Ask speakers to keep to time and to close with a single key-takeaways slide; share slides in advance.
- Less commercial / sales-oriented content — companies to bring more R&D; and fewer marketing teams; improve the industry-to-physician balance.
- Future topics suggested: efficacy & safety in ureteroscopy, PROMs and choosing wisely in stone treatment, AI and diagnostics, imaging (safety, follow-up, cost-benefit), sustainability and reusable scopes, BPH innovations, adjuvant stone therapies, unmet needs and innovation in PCNL, suction and integrated systems, biodegradable stents, guide-wire and UAS technologies, and robotics in endourology.
